Jose Causadias, Associate Professor

Expertise areas: Culture, Health, Psychology

Dr. Causadias is interested in the role of cultural rituals on the mental health of Latinx children, youth, and families.



Dawn DeLay, Associate Professor

Expertise areas: Gender, Identities, Intergroup Relations, Measurement and Statistical Anyalysis, Research Methodology, Social Influences, Social Networks

Dr. DeLay's research focus is on child and adolescent peer relationships. Key themes include how peer relationships impact child and adolescent adjustment and well-being.
